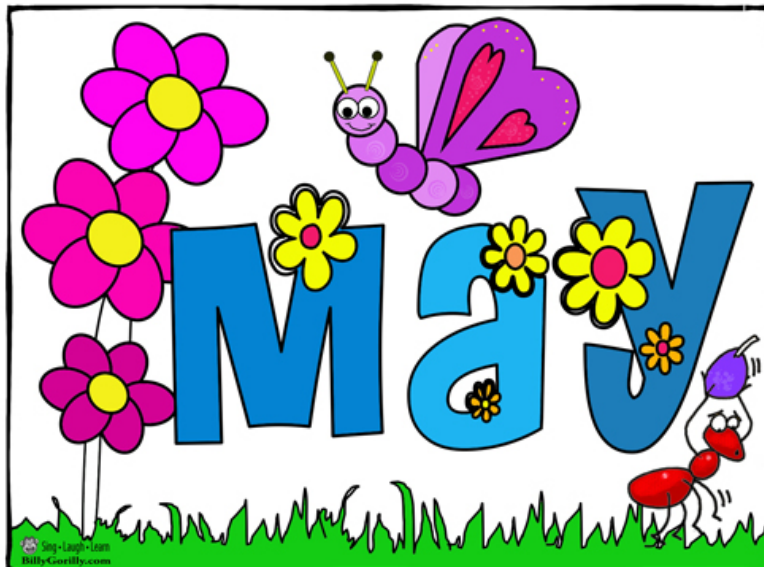

Frederick County Public Schools' Season of Celebration and Success

Hopefully your kids have mentioned the Summer Reading Program that the Aylor Library will be hosting. Our goal is to stop the "summer slide" and encourage students to continue reading even through the summer. NURSES CORNER



As the end of the school year approaches, many students have medications here at school. If your child has medicine in the clinic, you need to pick it up on or before the last day of school. If you cannot arrange to pick up the medication, please call or write a note to the clinic giving permission to send it home with your child. Otherwise, the medicine will be discarded after the last day of school.

**If your child is considering playing a sport during the 2017/2018 school year, we advise that you obtain a sports physical over the summer and turn it in to Pam Unhoch at the School Board Office or to Mrs. Bundrick at Aylor for approval ASAP. You MUST have an approved sports physical on file in order to try out and participate in middle school athletics. Sports physicals are good from May 2017-June 2018 if obtained after May 1, 2017. Getting the physical early will prevent delaying your child from trying out and or participating in the sport.

**If your child is requiring any long-term medications (i.e. inhalers, prescription medications, epi pens) for the next school year or any special care, please contact the school nurse (Mrs. Bundrick). The necessary forms are available on-line on the FCPS and R.E. Aylor websites. They are located under the Health Services tab. You will need to have these forms completed over the summer by your physician, and deliver them to school prior to the start of school.

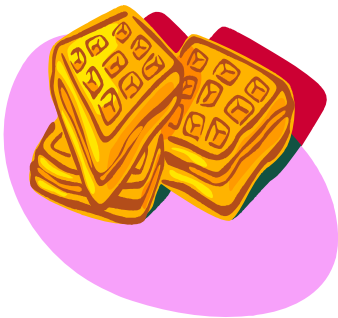

SOL Test Retakes to be Offered

Thanks to legislation approved by the General Assembly in 2015, students in grades 3-8 who fail an SOL test in reading, mathematics, science or history by a small margin may retake the tests they fail. A letter was sent home with all third through eighth grade students on April 19 detailing the criteria that must be met in order for a student to have the opportunity to retake an SOL test.
